




Uozu Buried Forest Museum [B-4]

A message from ancient times told by giant roots


The Uozu Buried Forest, which was buried about 2,000 years ago by overflowing rivers and the rising sea level, has been designated as a special national natural monument. It is a valuable source of information on environmental changes. In addition, a video at the museum explains the mechanism behind the mirages seen in Uozu.





Uozu Aquarium [A-6]
The oldest m in Japan

Founded in 1913, the Uozu Aquarium is the oldest aquarium in Japan. Its regular exhibitions feature around 410 types of living organisms, including aquatic life local to Uozu, centered on the theme of "The Science of the Sea of Japan." This aquarium also hosts a variety of events, such as striped beakfish swimming through a hoop.





Shinkiro (Mirage) Road [B-4]

Ideal for walking and cycling

Shinkiro Road is the popular name for the road that runs north to south along the Uozu City coastline. If the conditions are right, visitors can view mirages from Mirage Lookout along the road during the peak season. On sunny days, Mt. Sogadake, Mt. Kekachi, and the rest of the Northern Alps are visible from the road, making this one of the most popular driving routes in the prefecture.

Mirage Land [A-6]

Recognizable by the large Ferris wheel!

This park offers a variety of fun rides, including the largest Ferris wheel on the Sea of Japan and a merry-go-round. The seawater pool, which is open in the summer, is very popular with families and couples! And with rest areas, stalls, and a barbecue plaza looking out on the ocean, visitors can enjoy the facilities all day.

Suwa Shrine [B-4]

Famous as the shrine of the Tatemon Festival

A shrine whose origins are said to be in the division of the deity enshrined at Suwa Taisha in the year 701. It is famous as the site of Uozu's well-known Tatemon Festival. Every year, the day of the festival sees the shrine bustling with people.
